- AA Meetings are accessible to all; those who are deaf, in wheel chairs, nursing homes, home-bound, Spanish speaking, etc...
- Members are familiar with AA History. They participate in the decisions made within AA, its service entities and AA's Service Structure.
- AA members know that they may feel at home in any meeting but have one home group and know the difference between a group and a meeting.

If there was a “no”, WE can make it better! For ourselves and for those to come – the district is a part of AA's Service Structure, its Unity, and Service!
